The MVMYC was formed 1977 by a group of people interested in sailing.

The club has about 25 people capable of fielding more than 40 boats.

We are a sanctioned club of the American Model Yachting Association (AMYA); the national organization for R/C sail boating.

The MVMYC generally meets every Wednesday afternoon (1-3 PM) for fun racing & two weekends per month (1-3:30 PM) for scored racing at our shelter house on Jay Lake located in the rear of Wegerzyn Garden MetroPark at 1301 E Siebenthaler Ave in Dayton OH during the summer. If you have sailed full size boats before you will find the R/C sailboats to be a direct correlation.

If you haven't sailed before, any of our members are willing to show you how to handle a R/C sailboat.

You will find that generally you can jump in and sail a R/C sailboat from the very beginning without mishap, but to sail one extremely well can require years of practice.

In our club we have people at all levels of skill ranging from beginners to those who have won national sailing regattas.

A 45 inch semi-scale model of the full size yacht of the 1932 Olympic games. Some of these models are scratch built using plans available from the AMYA. Others are partially fabricated with major components available from suppliers. Radio controls the sails and the rudder.

A 39 inch model, along the lines of the Soling class yacht. The Soling one Meter can be purchased in Kit form or fully assembled by one manufacturer. Radio controls the sails and the rudder.

Radio controlled (RC) sailboats

- RC sailboats use only the power of the wind.
- Sails are set by the wind and controlled (in or out) by radio signals from hand held transmitters.
- The course of the boat is also controlled by radio impulses from the transmitter to the rudder servo.
- The boats are usually made of wood or fiberglass.
- The mast and booms are aluminum, wood or carbon fiber.
- The sails generally are of mylar, nylon, dacron or some combinations of these materials.
- The class of the boat regulates the construction and materials.

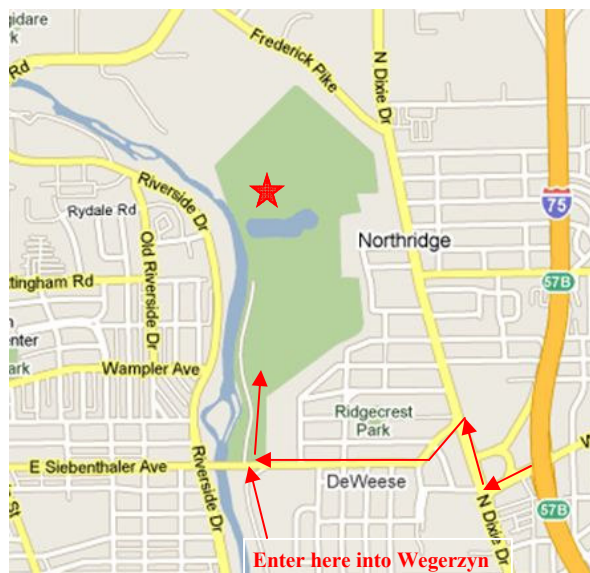
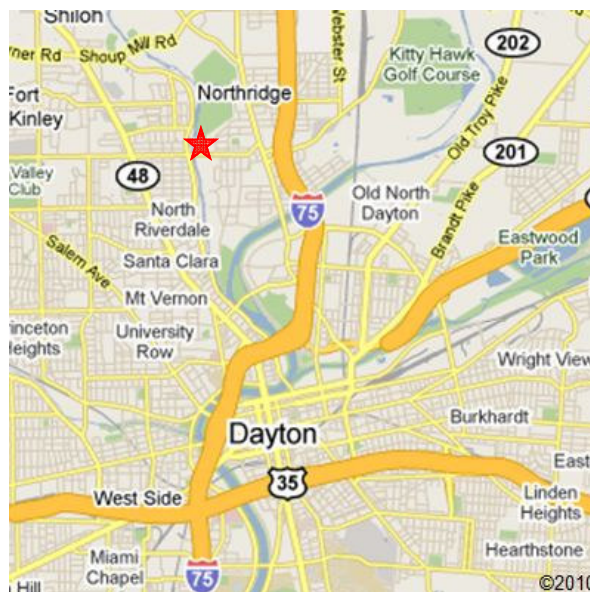


- Membership is open to all.
